## Laura Deschepper

In 2017 werd Laura Deschepper de administrator en office Key-Master bij SPIN, en sinds kort ook de co-directeur van het platform.

Laura (1992, BE) is een kunstwerker die zich richt op zakelijke coördinatie, productie en ontwikkeling.

Op dit moment opereert Laura tussen Brussel en Rotterdam, tussen structuren en niet-geformaliseerde initiatieven. Vanaf 2016 nam Laura het zakelijke stuur over in Bâtard festival. Daaropvolgend kwam SPIN op het pad en de nieuwe functie 'Key Master'. Na enige tijd in Rotterdam te wonen, werd Laura onderdeel van de lokale queer community. Samen met collega-*navigators* werken ze aan een lokaal platform (Queer Rotterdam) om leden te ondersteunen en te verbinden. Daarin wordt niet gestreefd naar een gemeenschap waarin conformiteit in stemmen en lichamen, maar eerder naar een flexibele ruimte waarin polyfonie zege viert. In 2018 werkte Laura ook als projectleider samen met ThisIsMaMa, een kunstruimte voor jongerencultuur en beeldende kunst in Rotterdam. Samen zetten zij de interactieve tentoonstelling 'Character Building' op poten.

Voorafgaand aan de Brusselse werkgelegenheden, werkte Laura samen met verschillende culturele organisaties uit Antwerpen: the Ministry of Operatic Affairs, Studio Bernadette, Stieglitz 19, Octopus Choir en SKaGeN.

Laura heeft een masterdiploma in theater- en filmwetenschappen (Universiteit van Antwerpen) gevolgd door een Master in Toegepaste Economische Wetenschappen, Arts Management (Universiteit van Antwerpen). In deze onderwijsprogramma's schreef ze papers en proefschriften over: 'hysterie', genderexpressie, vrouwen in film, beleidsvorming in de kunsten, artistiek leiderschap, en de digitale conversie in WACCO-culturele centra.

Blace been active in **Croatia's** new media culture scene since 1996, originally as web designer, artist and journalist - and later also in roles of organizer, researcher and curator (with)in several media culture focused NGOs:

- LABinary** (1999-2003), as co-editor of printed newsletter and organizer of events **new.media.culture.week** & **ASU2**
- radioActive** (2000-2002), as web editor, journalis and co-organizer of workshops/productions
- Multimedia Institute** (2000-2005), mostly as program/project coordinator in net.culture club MaMa and curator of exhibitions and events.

He was visiting artist/curator-in-residence at Thing.net (NYC), transmediale.de (Berlin) and UCSD.edu (San Diego) where he curated #1 exhibition of CalIT2 Gallery (2006).

As journalist and reporter he contributed to cultural programs of the national radio and TV (programs: *Transfer* and *Triptih*), occasionally publishing in IT magazines, more regularly in the cultural newspaper *Zarez* and on *radioActive*, *Kulturpunkt*, *ZamirZine* and *linux.hr* magazines and webportals. He advocated for non-profit net projects and worked on strengthening the impact of NGO sector on Croatian netspace (both in terms of infrastructure and legislation) in LastTuesday events and other initiatives.

He spent most of the 2007-2011 in the Netherlands as researcher in programs of Akademie JANvanEYCK.nl and phdArts.eu, as well as artist in residence at PartchingZone.nl and Roodkapje.nl in Rotterdam. He contributed to worksessions of ConstantVzw.org with f0.am, Beursschouwburg.be, and jointly with TeleKommunisten.net also at transmediale.de

Blace exhibited, presented and participated as visual and media artist/activist, as speaker/presenter at several international events (including Ars Electronica Festival, Net Congestion, Next 5 Minutes 4 (on editorial board), PingInProgress, NC48 - Graz, Money Nations II..). Since 2000 he works actively as a networker internationaly and has been (co-)organizing international events in Croatia: **Art Servers Unlimited** 2 (Labin, Sep 2001), new.media.culture.week Critical Upgrade! (Zagreb, May 2002) and tactical media events towards **Next 5 Minutes** 4 (Dubrovnik, May 2003; Vis, August 2003). He initiated Croatian *media-art-hr* and regional *nettime-see* mailing lists. In 2003 Blace established **a.network**, a co-ordination/production platform of regional media labs/centers, groups and individuals with mission to present new media culture and production in the South-East Europe.

### in/on/around SPORT

As of 2005 Blace worked actively on #QueerSport, organizing and instigating sport and recreation activities, discursive community events, presents and published on LGBT/Queer realities in sport. In 2006 he co-founded **qSPORT**, a society for sport recreation of LGBTQs. Blace works across art/cultural and social/political axis of sport in collaborative projects under **[1]**. He instigated the sport-culture-activism initiatives qSPORT/QueerSport.info in Croatia and ccSPORT.link in Berlin/Germany. His engagements from 2014 to 2017 include: Pop-up Rainbow with ToolsForAction.net, Kickertables with TimeLab.org, Entorse.org & Recommerce/Bains.be. He did Queering Sports session at VanAbbemuseum.nl, wkv-stuttgart.de and camp/lab activities at Timelab in Ghent and PROGR in Bern.

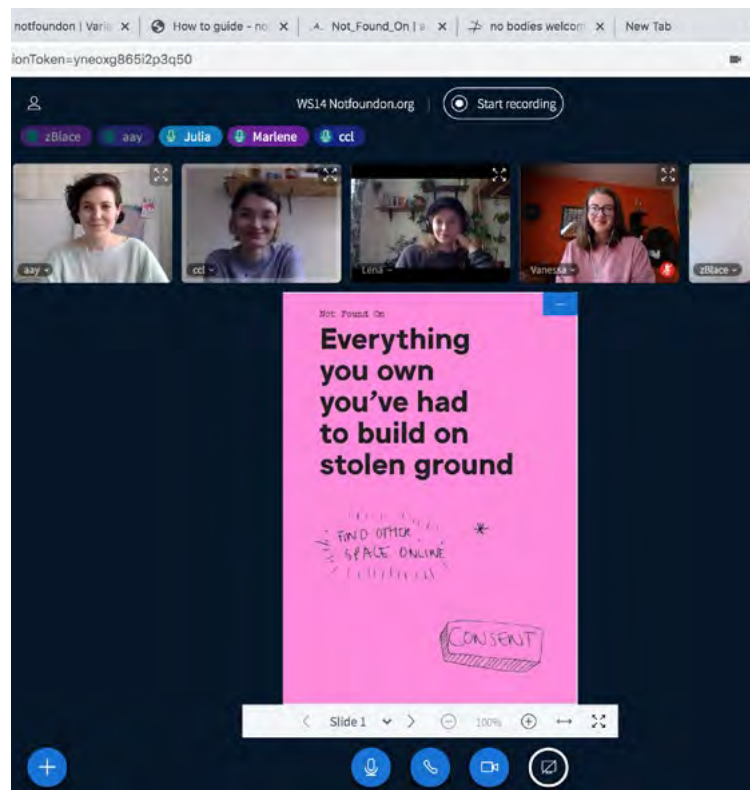

**Workshop Experience:**

Last May I participated in a Not Found On Workshop, which was held as part of the AMRO Festival (based in Linz, Austria). I wanted to join as I had been playing with the thought of putting together some sort of smaller collection of non-cis-male artists in the field of my study, I immediately got curious when I read the workshop description.

I appreciate a lot that Not Found On is much more than “just” a collection of names, but that it is a well thought-through and still evolving and changing platform that everybody can add to, and that has the potential to not only (re)write history, but also connect projects, collectives, bodies, etc. - either through the wiki itself, but for example also through the workshops, which I experienced as a great playground to write and think collectively.

I stayed in touch with the initiators of the project and for the near future I would like to connect Not Found On with projects such as Re#Sister (Rotterdam) and the pink noise Girls Rock Camp (Vienna), who I would like to invite to give more workshops and add themselves to the wiki, since these projects are very much about the visibility of female\*, queer and non-binary artists as well as creating (larger) networks where we can connect, create and share opportunities, support each other and work together.

In general I got really enthusiastic about the idea of using the wiki as a way to connect queerfeminist organizations, collectives and bodies around the world.

# RE#SISTER

RE#SISTER kwam tot stand rondom de elektronische muziekstudio van WORM in Rotterdam, op initiatief van Mariëtte Groot (organisator bij WORM). Zij stoorde zich aan het feit dat er maar weinig vrouwen, meisjes en non-binaire personen in die studio te vinden waren dus zij nodigde iedereen uit die ze kende in die doelgroep om samen muziek te maken, van elkaar te leren en elkaar te ondersteunen.

WORM heeft een studio vol vintage elektronische muziekinstrumenten zoals een ARP2600 synthesizer, ARP Odyssey, Fender Rhodes, Korg MS 20, Optigan, Serge en Buchla modules, Moog Theremin en een aantal drum machines. Leden van de RE#SISTER community ontmoeten elkaar daar eens in de maand, om nieuwe projecten te bespreken, de instrumenten te leren kennen en samen te improviseren. Iedereen heeft weer andere kennis en ervaring, dus de leden initiëren zelf workshops om die met anderen delen. Daarnaast worden regelmatig RE#SISTERS uitgenodigd om op te treden op andere locaties of festivals. WORM heeft RE#SISTER vanaf het begin ondersteund, facilitair en publicitair, en heeft een aantal leden opdracht gegeven om een radio-hoorspel te maken dat op een landelijke radiozender werd uitgezonden.

RE#SISTER werd geboren uit onvrede over het gebrek aan gender-diversiteit in de elektronische muziek-scene. De mechanismen die hieraan ten grondslag liggen zijn complex, maar komen voort uit stereotype gender-rollen, diepgewortelde tradities en glazen plafonds. Het open karakter van de groep en de grote variëteit aan talenten, ideeën en expertise, plus de onderlinge solidariteit maken het aantrekkelijk voor iedereen die interesse heeft in alles wat geluid maakt, ongeacht leeftijd of ervaring.

XÉNO-

Xeno- : (Non-profit organization)

Xeno- is an itinerant artistic platform and a research laboratory on gender and race issues with intersectional feminist tools. The platform dedicated to anyone who identifies herself as a womxn, especially racialized, queer and non-binary artists.

It was born out of the observation of the under-representation of these artists in exhibition programming, an absence that highlights the reality of gender and racial domination. Therefore, Xeno- supports, promotes and gives visibility to these emerging national and international artists, with a special attention to intersectionality. The main modalities of action are the production of cultural and artistic events: exhibitions, conferences and workshops.

Xeno- favors artists who show commitment in their creative processes, question the normative aspects of society, push their limits by initiating dialogue and reflection. Through creation and culture, the platform stimulates innovative and open reflection, a space for critical reflection based on difference and exchange.

Xeno- was created by the Tunisian artist Ichraf Nasri in Brussels in 2019 and has been working there since with Mélanie Peduzzi. The platform continues to work thanks to the involvement of several artists and activists.

ICHRAF NASRI, born in 1988, is a Tunisian artist settled in Brussels since 2013. Holder of a master's degree in fine arts from Acedemie des Beaux-arts of Sousse in Tunisia, she completed this cursu with a master's degree in visual arts at ENSAV la Cambre in Brussels. Then, she obtained a master's degree in Pedagogy of arts in 2018.

She is developing an artistic approach that is in line with an anthropological approach. From a critical reflection, she questions different aspects of the use of rituals in North-African culture. She proposes a subjective interpretation of these myths from which is born a will to show social realities often silenced.

Ichraf was an independent curator, taught photography and also worked as a journalist during the "Arab" uprisings of 2011 where she published articles and interviews on Astrolabe TV. She has participated in exhibitions such as "Artifices" in 2015 at the Botanique (Brussels, Belgium), "Uncheated" at the international photography fair Unseen in 2017 (Amsterdam, Netherlands) and "New Saints" at the Wouters Waldburger gallery (Brussels, Belgium) in 2020.

In 2015, she co-founded the Brussels art collective "Gush", which brings together five young photographers from different countries. Activist within several cultural associations in Belgium and Tunisia, Ligue de la Lutte de la Jeunesse, Fédération Tunisienne des Ciné Club, Habitant.e.s des Images and Fatsabbats etc. Decolonial feminist and committed artist, she joined FemmesProd in January 2019 to design mini-capsules videos/ articles on womxn artists in Europe. In October 2019 she founded Xeno-, an itinerant artistic platform and a research laboratory on gender and race issues.

MÉLANIE PEDUZZI (25/08/1989) is a Belgian artist, graduated from ENSAV La Cambre and now works between writing, performance and photography. She develops working protocols that question the imposed norms and the power of representation in contemporary society through actions and images based mainly on her own body. Since 2013, she has exhibited her work and performed in Belgium, France, Spain, Germany, Ireland and Burma. She has also co-created an artistic association based in Brussels that develops collaborative and engaged practices: Les Habitant.e.s des Images (images habitants).

In de rubriek STROOMOPWAARTS verkent Tamara Beheydt de Belgische hedendaagse kunst. Haar oog valt op kunstenaars die, klimmend naar de top, tegen de stroom in durven gaan: met verrassende onderwerpen, met vernieuwende technieken of met pertinente vragen. Deze maand: Aay Liparoto in M HKA.

In de groepstentoonstelling 'Together.' in het M HKA is een werk van Aay Liparoto opgenomen. De multidisciplinaire kunstenaar werd in de Verenigde Staten geboren, groeide grotendeels op in het Verenigd Koninkrijk en woonde ook al in Berlijn. Ondertussen woont en werkt die in Brussel.

'Together.' is de eerste institutionele tentoonstelling met enkel LGBTQIA+ kunstenaars in België. Een belangrijk gegeven, want hoewel er veel andere initiatieven, festivals, workshops, etc. rond queer kunst zijn, wordt die in instellingen vaak achterwege gelaten.

....

Het ontbreken van bepaalde collectieve kennis is een belangrijk motief voor Liparoto. Wat wij te zien krijgen en leren is bepaald door slechts enkele mensen en instituten die de macht hebben kennis te bewaren en te verdelen. Het internet is een belangrijke sleutel is het deconstrueren van dergelijke mechanismen, maar toch is niet alle kennis even toegankelijk. Vaak wordt het subversieve, het 'andere' subtiel uit de collectie kennis 'verwijderd'. Rond dit idee creëerde de kunstenaar Not Found On, een online 'queer archive project'.

## intro

Not Found On has been an intensive roller coaster of co-learning on the intersection between digital culture and DIY queer spaces. Which has focused primary on meeting together IRL and discussing the technology we use, how we can build our own spaces online.

The original proposal evolved from one primary research Think Tank day with invited guested into a series of 15 meet up/ workshop days, over the past 12 months. Each workshop informing the next stage of development of the platform, publication, installation and critical thought on the project. Always balancing the desire to share with the desire for safer spaces.

This was created primarily with the support of Worm and Stimuleringsfonds. With additional framework and support of European Media Arts Residency and Creative Europe Fund at FACT Liverpool [2019], Workspace Brussels Residency [2019] and Transmediale, E2E [2020].

## Our Wiki & our desires

We are using a MediaWiki and a Semantic MediaWiki structure that allows for collective writing and editing. We took our time to decide which non-commercial server space would fit the politics of the project as well as providing the infrastructure to support our desires for growth. We decided on Mur-at, an art server based in Austria.

The installation of MediaWiki on the Mur-at server was done by Cristina in April 2019. The installation of Semantic MediaWiki extension was done by Jessica in May 2019. The first pages were uploaded in June 2019, with the first form created in August 2019.

## Who is creating this, and who has access?

All aspects of the project are created by feminist, queer, trans and non-binary people, all with varying levels of knowledge about technology. It has been a collective learning process. Slow with much trial, error, tears and joy. This project is created by and with feminist, queer, trans, non-binary people for feminist, queer, trans, non-binary people.

When on the site you can register for an account without providing an email address or legal name. Despite this, your IP address may leave a trace and you may be identified by your location or name on an internet contract. We encourage you to use tools to mask your IP addresses, the use of pseudonyms and the sharing of collective accounts.

## Finding Not Found On

Our aim is to not appear in search engines, and so we ask not to be crawled by spiders. We also ask not to be shared on social media, which requires care on the part of those involved. We hand out invitations person to person, growing slowly in the process.

When entering the site we operate a soft barrier using obfuscation tactics, fulfilling the desire for an invisible gate. When going through this gate, you are met with a co-written entry text that is featured at the start of this publication. If this text resonates with you, join us in co-creation. This text will evolve with time.

Then you arrive at the wiki, there are currently 4 types of pages:

Record: Describe and share your project, research, space. . .

Events: Share time specific activities

Directories: Suggestions, links and connections

Information: Guide pages that describe how to use Not Found On

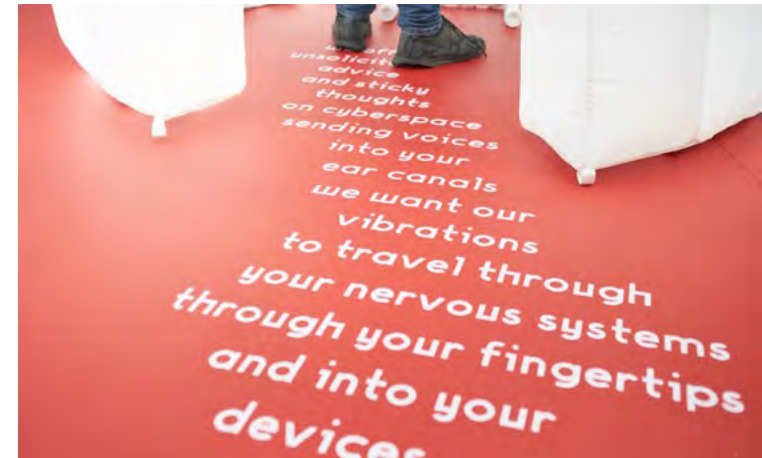


# no bodies welcome all bodies welcome

In looking for ways to transmit knowledge about online space through embodied queer practice and as a way to network Not Found On.

I began a collaboration with HOT BODIES – CHOIR in Brussels and through a series of workshops in September 2019 we looked for a way to combine the writing and singing practices of the choir with the co-writing of Not Found On. To find words and voice to together acknowledge our interdependence with digital technology as queer feminist bodies for information, work, sex, entrainment, communication, social life, healthcare and combinations of them all. In no bodies welcome | all bodies welcome we transmit a sticky mixture of reflections on cyberspace and offer unsolicited advice sent directly into your ear canals via an audio installation.



no bodies welcome | all bodies welcome is a speculative choir piece housed within a 'void pod', by Aay Liparoto, FACT's 2019 EMAP artist-in-residence. In their work, Liparoto acknowledges our interdependence with technology for information, work, sex, entertainment, communication, socialising, banking, healthcare and the crossovers in between. What does this web of interdependence, mean for queer feminist bodies which rely heavily on more DIY information exchange? Liparoto sees the need to question the politics and power of the spaces we participate in online and the behaviour of ourselves and others. As you step into the 'void pod', cocooned with light and sound you are invited to question too. The sound is created in collaboration with Hot Bodies – Choir, a feminist and queer choir based in Belgium.

Liparoto's artwork has been informed by their ongoing research Not Found On, part of which they carried out during their residency, where they held workshops across Liverpool with the aim to discuss the co-creation of an online knowledge bank with, by and for feminist queer bodies to record and exchange community knowledge.

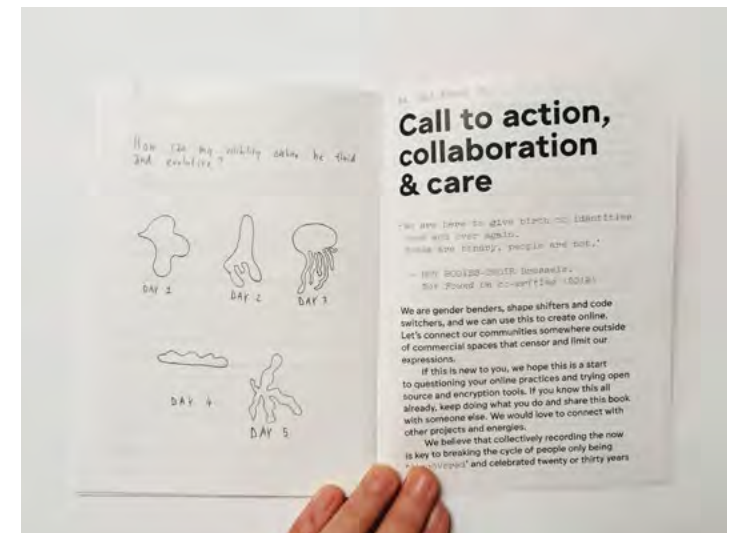

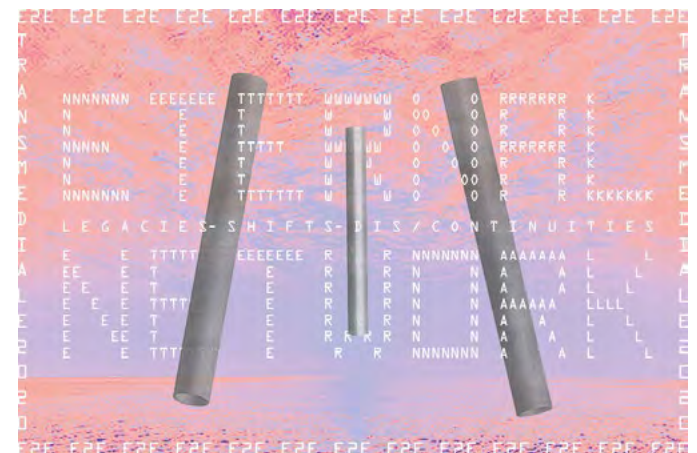

L: Over the last decades, through the democratization of digital technologies and the increasing digitalization of society, we have seen how social movements and political art have found a new form of expression, community and connection. Since its inception, the Internet has become a transformative space for artists, especially for those belonging to groups that have been traditionally excluded or confined to the private sphere. Queer and feminist activism has definitely found a tool in New Media. How do you see Not Found On and your practice in general within this genealogy?

A: As an artist I engage with deconstructing the power dynamics of everyday objects, I am a person with a body and phone and I rarely leave the house naked. Our daily life is saturated by new and old technologies, tools that transform us and that we co-exist with. Clothing and mobile phones are both technologies of bodily extension that we use to code and signal to various publics. However, in the latter, the scale of public is different. I am interested in actively using technologies to question how these materials produce behaviours and what capacity to shift, disrupt and demystify we have.

## Publicity, Distribution & Networking

It was a very social project with much one to one interaction and grew most authentically by going to events, talking to DIY organisers, discussing the different demands of queer spaces in different cities. This shifted the focus on personal labour away from a focus on paid editorial publicity which would not have necessarily reached or fulfilled our community base. Most meaningful developments came out of this more slow nurturing approach.

After the first think tank day the project shifted its focus to a more 'hidden' space looking for softer and particular spaces to reach smaller but more focused groups. Such presenting at Augment and Disrupt conference Utecht, going to Electric Tech Carnival a roaming feminist tech meet up in Athens and presenting at Transmediale which offered access to many thinking about sustainability queer tech and networks.
